Children's Mental Health Week



This year, Children's Mental Health Week is taking place from $3^{rd} - 9^{th}$ February 2025. The year the focus is '**Know Yourself, Grow Yourself**', with the aim to encourage children and young people across the UK to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them.

Being self-aware means getting to know and understand what we are good at, what we find difficult, our likes and dislikes, what makes us feel JOY and what may cause us SADNESS. It is also about understanding what makes us unique and our fears, hopes and dreams. As we build a

sense of self, we grow in our ability to connect with others, as well as develop our skills and talents. It is with this basis we can form strong and healthy relationships, from early childhood right through to adulthood and are equipped to cope with the challenges that life brings our way.

During Children's Mental health week, we will be working with the children on 'Active Listening' where we will ask everyone to really focus on what people are saying so that everyone is really heard. We will also be talking about our emotions and how important it is to feel comfortable sharing how they are feeling.

Musician of the Month



Every Monday afternoon starts with a music assembly for the children in years 1-6. As well as singing a range of songs, we are also using some new materials called "Musician of the Month."

For January, the musician is Florence Price. We have learnt about some of her life and listened to some of her music. **She was** an American classical composer, pianist, organist and music teacher. Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a

composition played by a major orchestra. In 2009, a substantial collection of her works and papers was found in her abandoned summer home.

RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch

The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch takes place this weekend. This is the world's largest garden wildlife survey. Every year, hundreds of thousands of nature lovers take part, helping to build a picture of how garden birds are faring. They are interested in species that are in decline, and those that are thriving. Families are asked to spend an hour quietly watching the birds in their garden.
