Summer Reading Challenge

Mrs Cheung from Cambridgeshire Libraries came to see us on Wednesday to introduce this year's Summer Reading Challenge. The theme of this year is "The Story Garden". The Summer Reading Challenge is a fantastic free event that runs throughout the school holidays. It's all about reading for fun, aiming to improve children's reading skills and confidence. The Challenge runs every year throughout the summer holidays, and all children aged 4-11 are welcome to take part.



Children can read anything they like (really - anything!) and collect free rewards for their reading. You can sign up at **your local library** and take part in person. A librarian will give you a special collector folder and help you find books to read. You'll collect special stickers and rewards for your reading, or you can take part **online** by signing up here, on the official Challenge website. You'll set up a profile with a reading goal and log your books. When you reach your goal, you will unlock a virtual badge and certificate.
