Mathematics

This term we will be covering the following units of work:

Place value

- Partitioning numbers to 10,000.
- Rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000



Addition and Subtraction

- Adding and subtracting 1s, 10s, 100s and 1,000s.
- Estimating answers and checking strategies.

Area

- What is area?
- Counting squares.



Multiplication and division.

- Times table and division facts.
- Multiplying three numbers and any number by 1 or 10.

How to help at home

- Talk about their day
- Read together daily and ask different types of questions about the text
- Practise using maths in real life situations, e.g. using money or telling the time
- Support with weekly homework
- Times table practice at home is extremely important in the lead up to the multiplication check in June.

English









The children will have opportunities to write a:

- Short story, inspired by Disney's Feast
- Non-chronological report, based on *Gut Garden*
- Poem, exploring different poetic techniques
- Short story, using The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse

During Guided Reading the children will be using the VIPERS approach as follows:

- V: Using the text to find the meaning of unknown vocabulary
- I: Developing the skill of drawing inferences ('reading between the lines')
- P: Using information in the text to make predictions
- E: Learning to explain answers about the text using evidence
- $R\!:$ Developing the skill of retrieving information from the text.
- S: Learning to pick out key points to summarise a text

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Art and Design: In art, children will explore festival feasts, taking their observational drawings into three dimensional structures.



Music: In music, the children will explore modern and classical music to learn about rhythm, pulse and melody.

We are also going to part of an exciting

Stapleford Granary and other schools in the Irust.

DT: In design and technology, the children will make a slingshot car and will use textiles and sewing skills exploring different types of fastening.

Computing: The children will be learning about computing systems and networks, in particular focusing

We will be focusing on Citizenship, where we will learn the difference between rights, wants and needs, and that rights come with responsibilities. We will consider our responsibilities at home and school, discussing them with

We will also be focusing on Anti-Bullying, exploring the fact that bullying is deliberately hurtful behaviour and looking at different forms of bullying. We will also be discussing why individuals may be bullied and how we can help them.



Science: We will be focusing on Living things and their Habitats. Children will be learning about how to group different living things using Venn and Carroll diagrams, classifying vertebrates and invertebrates, and exploring our local habitat. We will also be learning about environmental changes and their effect on living things.



Geography: The children will be investigating — Where does our food come from? They will learn about importing and food miles, responsible trading and local produce as well as the effect of our food choices on the environment. Please encourage the children to bring in food labels from home showing the name of the food and where it was produced.





History: In history, the children will question Why did the Romans settle in Britain? They will explore life in Roman Britain and the Romans' legacy.

Religious Education: Children will learn about how believing Jesus as their saviour, inspires Christians to save and serve others.
