Mathematics	English	Phonics	
<p>In mathematics we will explore number sense and build an understanding of early mathematical concepts. We will scaffold our subitising skills and explore patterns, grouping, sequencing and categorising objects according to their colour, shape and size.</p>  <p>The children will explore maths in the world around them and embed their learning through our daily routine and learning landscape. This will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One to one correspondence • Cardinality/counting to 5 • Composition of numbers to 5 • Number rhymes and games • Identifying 1 more and 1 less than • Exploring patterns in different contexts • Using counters to pay for our daily snack • Sorting/grouping/categorising objects • Conceptual subitising • Daily routine/days of the week 	<p>Writing</p> <p>The children will develop their gross and fine motor skills through daily activities and challenges available throughout the provision. This will enable them to begin holding and using writing tools when they are ready. They will explore and experiment with mark making through all sorts of play based activities. They may begin to form letters and start to write their name.</p> <p>Reading</p> <p>This term the children will be learning how to handle books correctly, create their own narrative using pictures from books and retell stories through imaginative play. They will be able to explore and enjoy quality texts across the learning landscape and develop a love of reading.</p> <p>Communication and Language</p> <p>We provide a language rich environment and opportunities for the children to discuss their thoughts and ideas in small groups, whole class and 1:1 activities. Our aim is to build their confidence, fluency and vocabulary through whole class story times, circle time, show and tell, talk partners, roleplay, Makaton signs and child led learning opportunities.</p>	<p>The children will work through phase 1 which consists of environmental sounds, instrumental sounds, rhythm and rhyme and alliteration. We then move on to developing their understanding of initial sounds in words, e.g. 'c' for 'cat'. The next stage is to develop their ability to recognise and write the Phase 2 graphemes.</p> <p>The Phonics scheme we will be using is called 'Little Wandle'.</p> <p>Please find out more:</p> <p>https://www.littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk/</p> <p>Key Texts</p> <p>We will be reading and role-playing lots of exciting stories this term (including fiction, non-fiction and poetry) to link in with our topics "Marvellous Me/People Who Help Us" and "Celebrations". They will experiment with colour, design, texture and form, such as using natural resources and construction materials to build houses.
