These webinars are an important way for us to launch Anglian Learning's early-intervention approach to supporting young people's mental health and wellbeing. By working in partnership with families and professionals, we aim to strengthen understanding, build resilience and promote positive mental health across our school communities.

The 'Mental Health: It's Not All In The Mind' webinar series shares practical, evidence-based strategies, grounded in the latest research and medical understanding, to support your own and your children's mental health. Topics include what causes depression, how everyday factors can affect our wellbeing, and ways to create opportunities for positive behaviour change.

Travelling Book Fair


