As part of Anti-bullying week, Year 6 decided to measure kindness. They spent time observing pupils in KS2 during break and lunch times, to see how kind we are to each other. They will be producing a spread-sheet to show their data. This links their PSHE learning with maths in the real world.

In Reception we've been having lots of story times about how we are kind to others. We read Sharing a Shell, The Smartest Giant in Town and The Squirrels who Squabbled and then we talked about how these made us feel.
